


YA POETRY CONTEST



Dear Friends at the East Northport Library,

One of the disadvantages of attending St. Anthony of Padua School when it opened in 1958 was the fact that they did not have a library. The advantage was that we, as students, were lucky enough to have access to your library.

During the summers of 1958-1964 I used to ride my bike from Greenlawn to East Northport for 8 o'clock class, then I would bike down to the library and take out the books I would read that day, and then ride home and read them, or stay in the little park next door and read and then ride home. From Clara Barton to George Washington, one summer I read all of the biographies you had in the Children's and Young Adult department. I was introduced to mysteries, fantasy and science fiction in your library and spent many wondrous hours there.

I noticed on my last trip to Long Island that you are renovating and I'd like to send along a donation. It isn't much, but being a teacher, I don't make much and a lot of that money goes to books and supporting my local public libraries. Please accept this as thanks for all the wonderful hours I spent in your library and the love of reading that your staff engendered in me. Your library is a very special place to me.

Make a new friend when you register for a local pen pal and receive your first letter through the mail in a drift bottle. Registration is now underway for children ages 7 and up.

SILVER STREAK STREAMERS

Create a 3-foot-long shimmering library streamer-flyer just in time for your 4th of July celebration. Children ages 5 and up may pick up this project beginning June 30.

CONSTRUCTION WORKER'S COSTUME

Pretend to be "on the job" with your very own construction uniform which is easily assembled with scissors, tape, and crayons. Children ages 2 to 5 may pick up this project beginning June 30.

LIBRARY MOBILE

Build a hanging mobile of the new Northport and East Northport libraries and the tools used at the construction sites. Children of all ages may pick up this project beginning July 7.

SUNGLASSES

Decorate the frames to create a pair of sunglasses using the materials supplied. Children of all ages may pick up this project beginning July 14.

COLONIAL PULL TOYS
